What information we collect, use, and why

We may collect or use the following information to **provide services and goods, including delivery and third party referrals**:

- · Names and contact details
- Gender
- Address
- Email address
- Date of birth
- Emergency contact details
- Next of kin details
- Photographs or video recordings
- Service use history
- Right to work information
- Health information (including medical conditions, test results, allergies, medical requirements and medical history)
- Dietary information (including allergies and health conditions)
- Information about care needs (including disabilities, home conditions, dietary requirements and general care provisions)
- Information about work, home and living conditions
- Information about support requirements
- Information about lifestyle, interests or personal history

- Contract we have to collect or use the information so we can enter into or carry out
 a contract with you. All of your data protection rights may apply except the right to
 object.
- Legal obligation we have to collect or use your information so we can comply with the law. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to erasure, the right to object and the right to data portability.
- Legitimate interests we're collecting or using your information because it benefits you, our organisation or someone else, without causing an undue risk of harm to

anyone. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to portability. Our legitimate interests are:

o Safeguarding children and families is central to our services and we may have to share information with the local safeguarding board and local authority to ensure children remain safe from harm

How long we keep information

We retain the personal data processed by us for as long as is considered necessary for the purpose for which it was collected (including as required by applicable law or regulation).

As a general guide:

Family (including parent/carer/child) details: will be retained for 6 years after completion of services. In some cases for example to comply with UK or European funding rules we are required to keep records for much

Employee data: all data will be retained for 6 years with limited data retained until the employee's 75th birthday (as required for pension administration)
